



Susan Lewellyn Pamerleau United States Marshal Western District of Texas

Susan Lewellyn Pamerleau serves as the 33rd United States Marshal for the Western District of Texas. She was confirmed by the United States Senate, then sworn in as United States Marshal on September 17, 2018. Marshal Pamerleau leads the second largest district in the US Marshals Service based on both staffing and geographic area. The District covers 93,000 square miles and sixty-eight counties in West Texas. Her responsibilities encompass security and protection of the United States Courts, criminal investigations, fugitive apprehension, execution of federal court orders and other law enforcement activities.

Prior to her appointment, Marshal Pamerleau served as the 38th Sheriff of Bexar County, leading the eleventh largest Sheriff's Office in the nation. She co-chaired the American Bar Association's (ABA) Law Enforcement Sub-Committee and the ABA Law Enforcement Task Force on Body-Worn Cameras. Sheriff Pamerleau was also invited by Senator John Cornyn to testify before the Senate Judiciary Committee on Mental Illness in the Criminal Justice System (2016).

She served 32 years in the United States Air Force, retiring at the rank of Major General. She commanded the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFROTC) at Maxwell Air Force Base in Alabama and the Air Force Personnel Center at Randolph Air Force Base in Texas.

After retirement from the Air Force, she served as Senior Vice President at USAA. Served on boards of directors and advisory groups for numerous civic and charitable organizations locally. Served on the Board of Directors for the Sheriffs Association of Texas, and actively involved with Major County Sheriffs' Association, National Sheriffs' Association, and the American Correctional Association.

Sheriff Pamerleau received her Bachelor's degree in Sociology from the University of Wyoming, a Master's degree in Public Administration (MPA), and Phillips University conferred an honorary Doctorate degree on Pamerleau in 1998. Also, attended multiple advanced executive courses at Northwestern University's Kellogg Graduate School of Business, Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, and The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. She is a graduate of the FBI National Executive Institute (2014).
