



Dr. Sudha Seshadri, Director of the Glenn Biggs Institute for Alzheimer's and Neurodegenerative Diseases

Dr. Sudha Seshadri is the Director of the Glenn Biggs Institute for Alzheimer's and Neurodegenerative Diseases, a National Institute of Aging Designated ADRC, one of 33 such centers nationwide and the only one currently in Texas. She combines clinical care and clinical research with biological and systems research, population neuroscience, public health, education, and training.

She serves on the 9-person Steering Committee of the Texas Council on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders and leads multi-institutional grants with other Texas academic centers.

Dr. Seshadri is a board-certified neurologist who specializes in behavioral and geriatric neurology. Over the past 15 years, she has received continuous funding from the National Institutes of Health, totaling \$83 million for her research. Additionally, she has been awarded prestigious grants, including the Bill Gates 'Part the Cloud' award, which recognizes innovative approaches to treating Alzheimer's disease. She has over 480 research publications and her work has been featured in national media including The New York Times, ABC, and Time on over 150 occasions. She also teaches the next generation of health care leaders, mentoring over 45 clinician-scientists in the past 10 years.

Dr. Seshadri aims to establish a legacy of effective preventive and therapeutic interventions for Alzheimer's disease, along with a group of dedicated and compassionate clinicians and scientists whom she has empowered.
